Below are three workshops planned for the coming months. I would strongly encourage you to take advantage of these as appropriate. For the lamb, goat, and cattle sessions, exhibitors are welcome to bring their projects.

#### <u>Swine</u>:

Thursday, November 21<sup>st</sup> 6:30 p.m. at the Extension Office. Topics covered will include managing weight, exercising, show preparations and showmanship.

#### <u>Sheep/Goats:</u>

Tuesday, December 17<sup>th</sup> 6:30 p.m. at the Extension Office. Topics covered will include monitoring condition, exercising, fitting and showmanship.

<u>Cattle</u>:

Thursday, December 19<sup>th</sup> 6:30 p.m. at the Extension Office. Topics covered will include final feeding, hair care and showmanship.

#### Coastal Bend Classic

Looking for a great learning opportunity as well as a chance to sharpen your showmanship skills? Mark your calendar for Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup>. Materials can be downloaded from the District 11 4-H website at http:// d114-h.tamu.edu . Look for a Coastal Bend Classic in the Events and Contest menu to get registered. Training topics will include facilities, feeding and nutrition, hoof trimming, animal health, handling and transportation, fitting and show preparations, showmanship and quality assurance. There will be a \$15 participation fee in advance or \$20 on site. Parents attend for free. The first 100 registered will receive a free t-shirt. Door prizes will be given at the clinics and awards will be presented during the show. Presenters and judges include Eric Drager, Mark Morris, Jeff Ripley, Keith Staggs, Michael Heaton and Dr. Billy Zanolini.

#### School Excuses

Remember, it is your responsibility to contact the Extension Office in advance for school excuses. We need at least 10 days notice. You will be eligible for excuses competing through any 4-H project or activity provided you are passing all your classes. As always, if you know you will miss school, make sure and alert your teachers and get assignments early if possible.

#### LIVESTOCK PROJECT REMINDERS

**Show Cattle** - steers should be on a finishing ration (~50% corn) consuming somewhere around 2% of their body weight a day. For example, if your steer weighs 1,100 he should be eating around 22 pounds a day. Heifers should be consuming around 1.5% a day. Keep in mind these are guidelines and each individual project is different. Steers and heifers both need a good high quality supply of roughage in their diet along with plenty of clean water. I've noticed several people have fly problems. Keep your pens clean and carry manure way away from your pens. From a health standpoint, you should be rotating wormers every 100 days as well as checking for lice and ticks. From a bio-security standpoint, if you're hauling to shows regularly remember to disinfect your equipment, trailer, etc.

**Hogs** - make sure that your pens are safe, no sharp edges or corners that a pig could cut or injure itself on. With cool nights and relatively warm days, pigs can have a tendency to get sick. Keep some antibiotics on hand with clean needles and syringes. If you make any changes to their diet, do it slowly over the course of a few days. Pigs should be eating a 16-18% protein ration. If your pig is hard muscled, lower the protein and consider adding liquid fat. If your pig needs more body, add steam rolled oats or beet pulp to the ration. You should be worming your pigs every 30 days. Fresh, clean water is a must and needs to be available at all times. If you have visitors, ask them not to get into your pig pens. If someone absolutely needs to, consider a foot bath or invest in some plastic boots to avoid possible spread of disease.


Lambs and Goats - exhibitors should consider weighing their projects occasionally to get idea of where you are at. Scales are available at the Extension Office. Be sure and monitor condition on lambs and goats. Don't wait until January to begin thinking about an exercise program. From a feeding standpoint, lambs and goats should be eating between 3-4% of their body weight. Remember, all animal projects are different and there is not an universal program that will work for every lamb and goat. Spend some quality time working on bracing and leading lambs and goats. When you tie them up, always have their head up. Keep a fresh supply of water available at all times. You should be worming your projects every month and keeping their feet trimmed.
