AWARDS PROGRAM CRITERIA

100% Club Attendance Award

- 100% attendance at all monthly club meetings
- Must attend all meetings, NO exceptions!



Project Completion Certificate

- Project record form must be completed and submitted to the Extension Office by June 30th of 4-H year.
- Members must complete a project record form for each 4-H project that they participate in to receive recognition.
- Certificates are given at annual award ceremony. Members not attending ceremony contact the Extension Office or Club Manager to receive certificate.



County Medal

- Medals presented to 4-H members who completed a 4-H Awards Record Book.

4-H Clover Booster Club Scholarship

- Must be a member of the Bandera Co. 4-H program for a minimum of 3 years.
- A high school senior attending Bandera or Medina High School or participate in a Bandera County qualified Home School program.
- Must be an **ACTIVE** participant in 4-H to include demonstration of leadership, community service, and attend a minimum of 50% of club meetings.
- Must enroll in a two year or four year curriculum at a college or vocational/technical School.



Silver Star Award

- Be between the ages of 11-13 as of August 31st of current 4-H year.
- Submit a 4-H Awards Program Record Book in the year to be considered for this Award.
- Must participate in a District 10 4-H Contest.
- Complete a minimum of three (3) 4-H projects.
- Must have exhibited leadership skills by serving as an officer, committee chairman, And/or serve as a junior or teen leader in a project.
- Must have participated in one or more community service activities.
- This award can only be received once in 4-H career.



Gold Star Award

- Be 15 years of age as of August 31st of current 4-H year.
- Must have completed at least three (3) years in 4-H include current year.
- Submit a 4-H Awards Program Record Book in the year to be considered for award.
- Must have completed projects in three (3) different project areas, including submitting a project record form for each project.
- Must have attended District 10 Leadership Lab during 4-H career.
- Participated in one or more activities in at least three (3) of the following areas:
 1. Educational presentation
 2. Citizenship activities
 3. Projects
 4. Project Exhibits
 5. Camps
- Must have exhibited leadership skills by service as an officer, committee chairman, and/or serve as a junior or teen leader in a project.
- This award can only be received once in 4-H career.

Outstanding Adult Leader

- Must be a Bandera County 4-H leader
- Serve as a project leader and/or club manager for a minimum of two (2) years.
- Attend trainings provided by Bandera County 4-H and/or District 10 4-H.
- Adult Leaders candidates nominated at March 4-H Club Meetings - voting takes place at April 4-H club meetings.
- This award can only be received once in 4-H service career.



Friend of 4-H

- An individual, business or civic organization in the community that has contributed to the 4-H program.
- Friend of 4-H candidates nominated at March 4-H Club Meetings, - voting takes place at April 4-H club meetings.
- This award given only once to individual, business or civic organization.
