DEADLINE TO RENEW LIVESTOCK BRAND **REGISTRATION IS FEBRUARY 28TH**

If you have a livestock brand registered with the Bandera County Clerk's office, the deadline to re-register your brand is February 28th. If you do not re-register by the deadline, the brand will be considered unclaimed and can be registered by another person. Once registered, the brand will be registered until August 2031 when the renewal period will begin again. As a reminder, the brand must be re-registered in the orginal county is was registered in.

USDA OFFERS ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS TO HELP RECOVER FROM WINTER STORM DAMAGE

If you experienced any losses of crops/livestock due to last week's freeze, the USDA offers multiple financial relief programs to help producers recover from losses experienced due to natural disasters. Such programs include the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees, and Farm-Raised Fish Program, the Livestock Indemnity Program, and others.
