TEXAS OLIVE GROWERS SEMINAR

Olives are a rapidly growing industry in central Texas with a great deal of research attached to it. To help keep growers updated on the latest Texas olive research, an olive grower's seminar will be held in Uvalde on **June 3**rd **starting at**

8:30am. Lessons learned over the past 25 years of commercial olive production in Texas will be shared, setting the stage for what the future of the industry might look like. The challenges of olive production will be discussed in detail, along with findings and recommendations to mitigate these challenges. Attendees will also hear presentations on the results of research on olive cold-hardiness and disease resistance. Findings from six years of coordinated olive


variety trials across Texas will be discussed, and there will be a tour of one of these trials on-site. The program will conclude with discussion on the best practices for olive and olive oil production in Texas. The event will be held at the Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Center at Uvalde; doors will open at 8am and the program will conclude at 1pm. BANDERA COUNTY LISTED AS PRIMARY DISASTER AREA

The beginning of 2022 has been exceptionally difficult for agriculturalists across the state of Texas. Between high feed and fertilizer prices, a months long lack of significant rain, and wildfires dotting west and south Texas, many producers are looking for relief. Currently, we are considered to be in a D3 Extreme Drought by the USDA and NOAA.

Bandera County, along with 173 other Texas counties, have been designated as "primary disaster areas" due to the severe drought conditions, and producers within these counties have the opportunity to apply for emergency loans. These loans can be used to replace lost equipment and livestock, reorganization of operations, and refinancing of certain debts. Applicants have until December 8th to file an application.
